Responsibility of Wrestling Timer, Assistant Timer and Scorer

Instruct the match timekeeper that he is:

1. In charge of assistant timekeepers and scorers and should be constantly checking their activities at all times.
2. Responsible for keeping the over-all time of the match.
3. Responsible for recording accumulated time-outs for injury.
4. Responsible for informing the Referee, only after an imminent situation has passed, whenever there is disagreement by the official scorers and/or timekeepers.
5. Responsible for assisting the Referee in determining whether a situation occurred before or after the termination of a period.
6. Responsible for calling the minutes to the Referee, contestants and spectators in each match. The last minute shall be reported at fifteen-second intervals.

Instruct the assistant timekeepers that they are re-
