Wichita East, Hays And Parker State Track Champions

Wichita East Only 1958 Champion to Repeat; Six New Records Set

The Wichita East Blue Aces of Coach Bob Timmons annexed their third consecutive track and field title, and their tenth in the past fifteen years, in the Class AA division of the State Track and Field Meet held at Wichita University on May 15 and 16. East, displaying outstanding team strength, rolled up 34½ points to out-distance challenging Wyandotte which had 26. Arkansas City took third place honors with 20 points, followed by Shawnee Mission North, Topeka and Washing-

ton (Bethel) with 18, Sumner 14, McPherson 12 and Wichita North 10.

Hays took first in four events for 20 points to win its first Class A title. Dale Alexander, the outstanding Hays sprinter, won the 100 yard dash and the 220 yard dash for the third consecutive year. Alexander walked off with first place in the 440 yard dash. Hoisington, for the second straight year, lacked less than one point of capturing the state championship. It was Coach Elton Brown's outstanding relay teams that helped Hoisington accumulate 19½ points to edge the place Haskell with 19. Goodland scored 17½, Wakefield 17, Osawatomie 14 and Sabetha 11.

Parker won first in the shot, discus and mile to take the Class B crown with a total of 15 points. Second-place winner in the Class B was Plains with 8. Wakefield was third with 10½, followed by Peabody and Preston with 9 and Arma, Cheney and Lakin with 8.

Fair weather prevailed both days for the preliminaries and finals, however, a strong southerly wind Saturday undoubtedly prevented several new records from being established. Three new records were set in Class AA. Archie San Romani, shooting for a new national record, lowered his own mile run record to 4:11 while Roger Schmanke from Ottawa was also breaking his own pole vault mark with a jump of 12' 10". On Friday, McPherson's Pete Talbot heaved the javelin 2 feet to smash the old record set by a former teammate Ken Barber.

Three new records were also established in Class B when Hoisington shattered its own mile relay record with a time of 3:26.9, and bettered the 880 yard relay mark, set by Lincoln in 1958, with a 1:32.1 time. Dick Perry from Hugoton broke the sixteen year pole vault record with a tremendous 13' 1" vault. No new records were established in Class B.

Wichita West And Assaria New Baseball Champions

Wichita West won their first Class AA-A baseball championship in the state tournament held at El Dorado on May 7-11 and Assaria won its first Class B title in the state tournament held at Peabody on May 7-12. Both tournaments were delayed by rain.

West won the AA-A championship by defeating Newton in the finals 8-3. To reach the finals, West defeated the 1958 champs, Ward of Kansas City, 1 to 0 in the opening round and El Dorado 3-0 in the semi-finals. Newton defeated Great Bend 4 to 1 in the initial round and Wyandotte 7-2 in the second round of play.

In the Class B tournament at Peabody, Assaria completed an undefeated season and took home the first place trophy by defeating Windthorst 12 to 3 in the finals. Coach Roger Birkhead's Assaria team had previously shut out Arnold 5 to 0 in the first round of play and won over Uniontown 7-4 in the second round. Windthorst gained a final round berth by disposing of Virgil 5 to 1 in the initial round of play and then defeated previously undefeated Frankfort 8-4 in the semi-final round.

All teams qualified for the state tournament through regional play. Four Class AA-A regionals were held at Plainville, Newton, Wyandotte and El Dorado, with winners of first and second places qualifying for the state play-offs. Class B regionals were held at Silver Lake, Windthorst, Uniontown, Grinnell, Lucas and Rose Hill, with first-place winners qualifying for the state championship tournament. Arnold and Virgil, second-place regional winners, were invited to complete an eight-team bracket in the Class B division.

Wichita East, Shawnee Mission East, Wellington and Holton Golf Champions

Three new golf champions emerged from the state golf tournaments held May 15 and 16, with Wellington's two-man team of Bill Whitney and Wilbur Thompson and their medalist, Wilbur Thompson, being the only 1958 champions to retain their titles. Wichita East won the four-man grass greens crown with Shawnee Mission East taking the two-man and medalist honors. Holton annexed the four-man sand greens championship.
