TRACK

Track continues to hold the major interest of the high schools as far as spring sports are concerned. More high schools participated in track in 1930 than in 1929, and this in spite of the fact that in the extreme southwestern part of the state several schools discontinued track and took up baseball.

Approximately ninety approved preliminary meets were held as qualifying meets for the nine regional meets. The relays in the regional and state meets were divided into two classes and this apparently increased the number of schools and athletes participating in these particular events.

The 1930 State Meet

Wichita High School East won the state track title for the second consecutive year, although only one of its athletes, Sutter, was able to win a first place. By placing in a large number of events the Wichita team was able to score 20 points. Arkansas City, which has not been a contender for a number of years, won second place with a total of 4½ points; Pleasanton won third place with 13 points, all scored by Delbert White, tar negro jumper and discus thrower. Wyandotte scored 11 points, Elkhart and Topeka 10 each, and Jetmore, Pittsburg, and Wichita North 6 points each.

Glen Cunningham of Elkhart set a new record in the mile run of 4 minutes 28.4 econds. The former record of 4 minutes 30.5 seconds was held by Manning of Sedgrick. White of Pleasanton also broke the discus record with a throw of 134 feet $9\frac{7}{8}$ inches. Merkle of Meade held the previous record of 134 feet $7\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

The meet was held on the State Agricultural College track and field at Manhattan under the direction of M. F. Ahearn, director of athletics, and Ward Haylett, track wach. A heavy rain interfered with performances and perhaps saved several other records.


