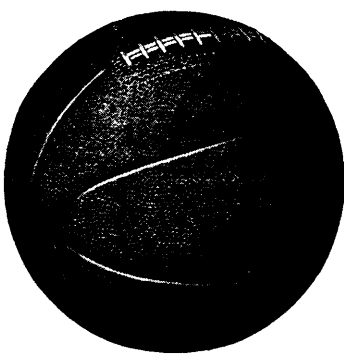

TRACK

Track continues to grow in popularity among the high schools of Kansas. During the 1933 season more approved qualifying meets were held than ever before. The entry lists for the larger invitation meets were not so large but more meets were held in which small groups of schools participated. Economic conditions kept some from sending any but those who had a chance to win to the regional and state meets and the entry lists for these meets were not quite so large as in 1932. However, all meets paid expenses, which were curtailed considerably.

The 1933 State Meet

The 1933 state meet was held May 20 at Emporia on the Teachers College track and field. It was a beautiful, warm day and several records were broken. McCaskill of Wichita North lowered the 440 record to 49.4 seconds. It was formerly 50.1 seconds and was held by Schroeder of Bendena. Landers of Arkansas City tied the 15.5 seconds record for the high hurdles; Papin of Iola set a new record of 22 feet 11⁵/₈ inches in the broad jump; and the Kansas Vocational School medley relay team set a new Class B record of 2 minutes 31.5 seconds.

Forty-one schools scored points in the meet and Wichita North won the championship with a total of 28¹/₂; Arkansas City, last year's champion, was second with 20¹/₂; and Wyandotte and Kansas Vocational School tied for third place with 14 points each. Downs scored 13 points, Ottawa 12, Yates Center 8, Topeka 7¹/₂, and Winfield and Valley Falls 6 points each.

The meet was held in connection with the state tennis and golf tournaments.

At the Chicago Meet

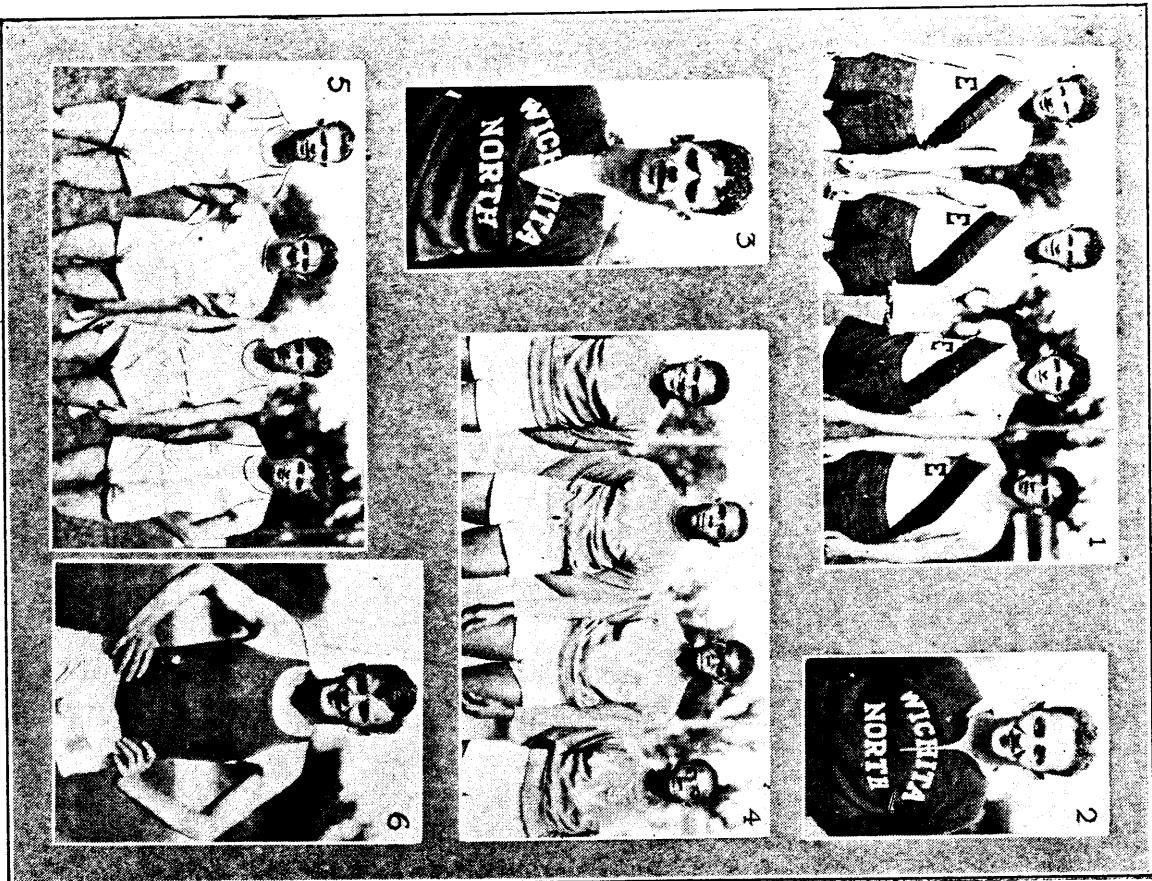
At the invitation high school meet in Chicago, sponsored by the University of Chicago and held in connection with the Century of Progress Exposition, the Kansas schools scored more points than those of any other state and the Wichita North team, Kansas champions, won second place in the individual school scoring with a total of 35 points. Kansas won seven first places and Raymond Noble of Arkansas City broke the Chicago meet pole vault record by vaulting to a height of 13 feet 4¹/₄ inches. He lacked only 2¹/₄ inches of equaling the national high school record. Ralph Brown of the Kansas Vocational School won the fastest section of the 440 in 49.3 seconds and Paul McCaskill of Wichita North won another section of this race in 50.3 seconds. The Wichita North mile relay team broke the meet record in the fast time of 3 minutes, 26.3 seconds and the Ottawa half-mile relay team won that event in 1 minute 31 seconds. Sam Francis won the shot put with a put of 53 feet 3 inches and George Winter of Wichita North won the discus throw with a toss of 136 feet 9³/₄ inches. Several of these marks are better than our Kansas state records.

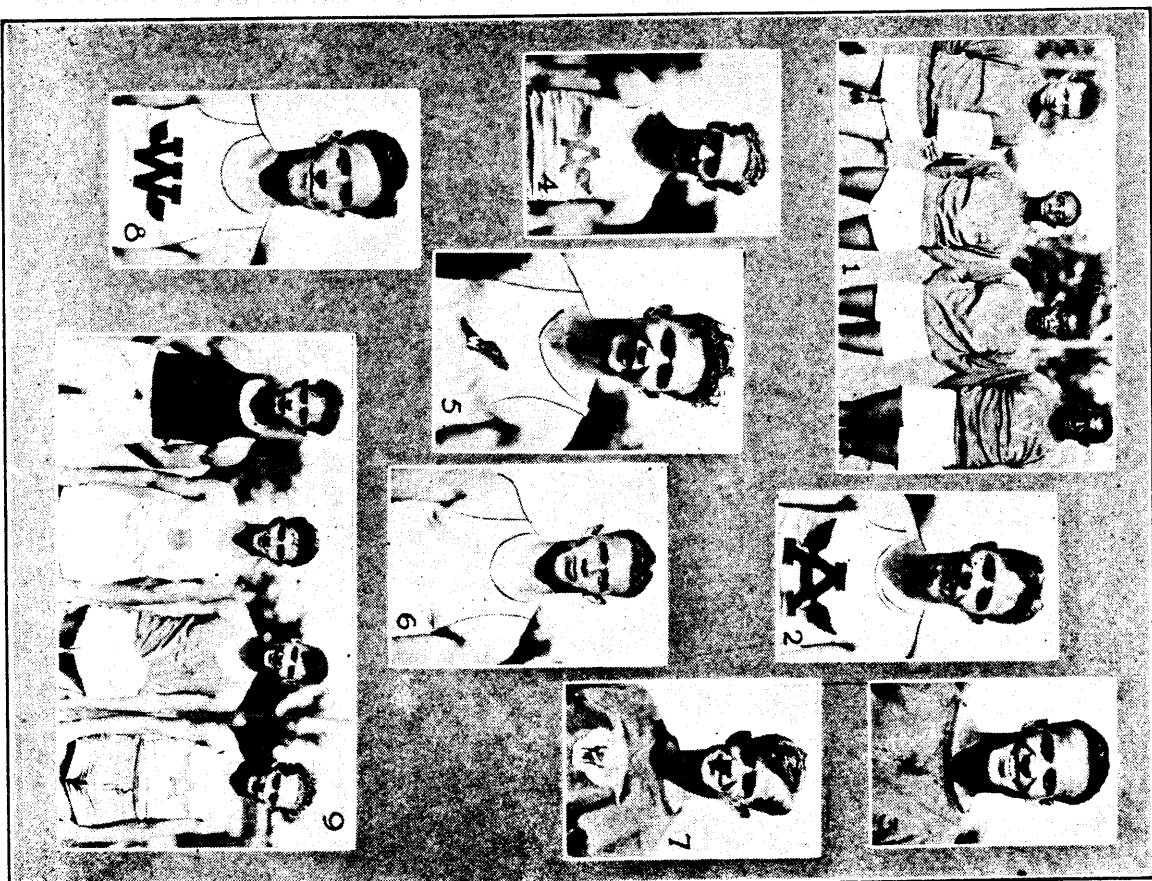
